



Krystle Kaul and Rajiv Malhotra in Conversation




As campaigning for the US elections gathers steam, traditionally practicing Indian Hindus with their ethnic diversity and background in the Vedas and Itihasas bring a uniquely centrist perspective to both Republican and Democratic discourse.

In this video, Rajiv Malhotra

interviewed the first ever Kashmiri Hindu-Punjabi Sikh female candidate running for the US Congress from Northern Virginia as a moderate democrat. Many are unaware of the close relations between Hindus and Sikhs, as Hindus inducted their sons into Sikhism for the protection of dharma, making it natural for the two to co-exist in the same family. We learn that Krystle comes from such a family.

A large number of issues affecting Indian Americans and Hindus in particular were discussed. Some of these included her positions on Islamophobia as well as phobia against other religions, racism (including her own childhood experiences), genocide of Hindus in Kashmir and her determination to get the Kashmiri genocide recognized in the US, violence against Hindus on campuses, Wokeism, grooming, structural issues of the USCIRF and the quality of reports produced by them, DEI and ESG versus meritocracy, as well as equitable representation in academic and other organizations. 
R Buvaneswari has been our head of Administration since 2018.

Ujwwala Amrapourkar is an administrative consultant.



Our Performance


This section provides a brief overview of our recent performance. In the first chart below, we present the cumulative performance of our YouTube channel over the past year. As is evident, we have materially grown our views, watch time and total subscriptions during this period. The success of a strategy significantly improved our YouTube performance this year.



In the second chart, we present the cumulative reach of our Facebook page in the last twelve months. Our performance on Facebook shows continued growth on all key metrics, as we expanded our reach, increased traffic to our page and garnered an ever-growing number of likes and follows.

Our Content

Exposing the Ivy League Agenda | Breaking India 2.0 | Sam Sharma Show



This was a lively discussion about the role the American ivy league has played in villainizing Hindus and strengthening Islamists, the Islamic strategy of adopting the left to garner intellectual support for their global conquest, and what the Indian government can do to counter the false and hateful narrative against Hindus.


The situation was not always like this however. When Americans were looking for spirituality earlier, Hindu gurus lost the opportunity. But Buddhist conversions have today led to far more respect for Buddhism both in the academy and among the public. Gandhi inspired many such as Martin Luther King, and India was viewed as the voice of the third world back then. But we missed the opportunity when Blacks needed allies for the BLM

movement. As a result, our natural allies have now teamed up with Islamists.

Islamists on the other hand took just 20 years to change anti-Muslim sentiment after 9/11 to pro-Islamic positions, having infiltrated all major government departments, thinktanks and institutions. The billions from Saudi Arabia, Quatar, Iran, etc was used to co-opt the left in American ivy leagues, and today, anti-Hindu and anti-Jew narrative is normalized while any criticism of Islam is Islamophobic. They have successfully extended the Palestine movement to Kashmir. The attacks against Jews today will be directed against Hindus tomorrow. Khalistanis have joined this alliance. Today their people are being planted in all security and DEI positions.

It is unfortunate that while there is pushback from Jewish billionaires funding these universities, there is no such pushback from Indians. The Hindu Jewish Alliance is now interested in helping Hindus but the Indian government should also play a role. It can help by talking to these billionaires. Conferences through ICCR on the state of India studies in the US has also been proposed by IF. They could help with that. RSS could mobilize their international wing. [Video](#).

Sanatana Dharma - the eternal way of life by Rajiv Malhotra



Rajiv Malhotra explains that Sanatana Dharma or eternal truth is beginningless and endless, and therefore, not stuck in history. In Hinduism, which is the modern name for Sanatana Dharma, we therefore believe in certain eternal truths that are not falsified by any new scientific theory or discovery. They were discovered by the rishis as a result of their tremendous tapasya and are available to each one of us to discover for ourselves.

Although we have these eternal truths in the form of the Vedas (Shruti), we also have more time-specific shastras, such as the Smritis, which are required to be written in accordance with the times, the society, location, laws of the times, etc. as indicated by the authors themselves.

Because Sanatana Dharma is eternal, with the macrocosm reflected in the microcosm (as expressed in our deities), the loss of all this knowledge can be rediscovered by any of us all over again through yogic, tantric, bhakti and other practices. Therefore, in this tradition, gurus and priests are important and useful as a support system, but not necessarily as the medium to discover the divine.

Olacabs Co-Founder & CEO Bhavish Aggarwal with Rajiv Malhotra



Rajiv Malhotra expressed concern about the Woke ideology penetrating Indian educational institutions and corporations.

He was particularly concerned about the DEI part of it, because it targets meritocracy and could therefore weaken our institutions.

Bhavish Aggrawal explained his dharmic upbringing, which made him realize that our traditions could very well co-exist with and even enhance modern progress. He said that he was encouraged about the fact that fewer IITians are going abroad today than in the past and that a lot of the funding for which Indian startups were earlier dependent on FDI were now available from within India. In fact, domestic investment in the economy was increasing steadily and this would make India less reliant, on foreign funding that came with any strings attached that could potentially harm India.

The two of them also discussed data security, the development of Indian technology for India that could also help the world and collaborating on Sanskrit-based LLMs for the AI of the future. [Video.](#)
